Can we bring outside food and beverages? Coolers and bags?

The Zoo allows outside food and beverages on grounds. These items can be brought with you inside of a bag or cooler. Glass containers and alcohol are not allowed.

Are motorized wheelchairs available for rent?

Electric shop riders are available for \$28 each per day. Manual wheelchairs and adult chairs are \$9 each per day.

Both are available at the Main Gift Shop, located near the main entrance of the Zoo, year round. Rentals are available on a first-come-first-serve basis.

Do you have an ATM?

An ATM is located inside of the Zoo's Main Gift Shop near the main entrance of the Zoo. The ATM is serviced by First National Bank of Omaha.

Are there additional costs besides the admission charge?

Zoo admission covers entry into all of our main exhibits. The following require an additional charge: train, tram, Skyfari, Sue's Carousel, the Lozier Theater, Stingray Beach, Budgie Encounter, Giraffe Encounter, concessions and gift shop purchases.

Conservation at the Zoo

Omaha's Henry Doorly Zoo and Aquarium has built a vigorous program of scientific investigation in the fields of molecular genetics, reproductive physiology, nutrition, plant micro propagation and conservation medicine. The work done here is intended to have a global impact through numerous in-situ and ex-situ projects and collaborations in conservation programs. All

of our programs place great emphasis on student and professional training, technology transfer and research in the conservation of endangered species.

Original Facility

First opened in April 1996, at a cost of \$2.4 million, the original three-story research building and attached veterinary medical facility contained 16,448 square feet. The facility consisted of housing, an animal nursery, a surgery suite, several research laboratories, a student dormitory and offices.

Expansion

The \$6 million expansion increased the facility to 175% of its original size. The expansion doubled the research area and provided additional medical facilities, greatly enhancing the Zoo's ability to respond to national and international conservation needs. This expansion also allows the Zoo to provide more effective training for students and colleagues from around the world.

Attractions

Omaha's Henry Doorly Zoo and Aquarium offers alternate ways to see the Zoo. Climb aboard the Omaha's Zoo Railroad and take a ride on the steam locomotive or get a new view of the Zoo from above on Skyfari , a ski-lift style ride. Travel back in time with a ride on Sue's Wildlife Carousel, an American tradition designed in authentic turn-of-the-century detail or sit back and explore the Zoo on the tram.

All rides are weather dependent and will not operate if there is rain, snow, ice or if the temperature will not reach 50 degrees by 1 p.m. Skyfari will not operate if there are high winds.

You must be at least 12 years old to ride Skyfari without an adult. Children under the age of 12 will be required to ride with an adult.

You must be at least 42 inches tall to ride Sue's Wildlife Carousel without an adult.
